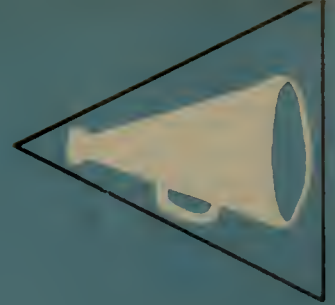

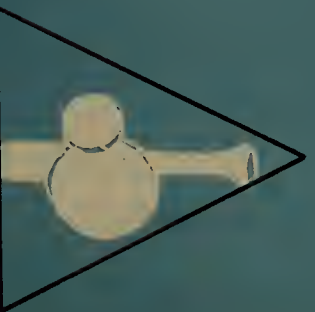

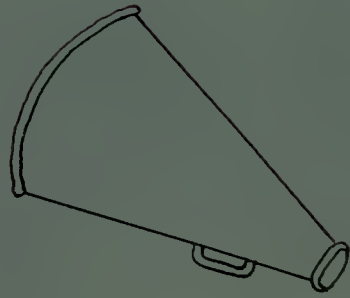

Time may help to soften the sorrow of losing her, but Time can never erase the joy of having known her.



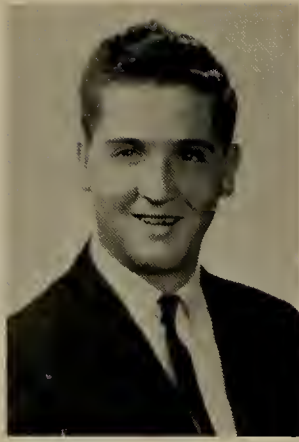
